Brief Description of Course What will the course cover?	<p>This course is suitable for you if you are looking to explore a brief introduction into the fibre crafts of Crochet and Macramé.</p> <p>This course requires no previous experience and is taught in a friendly and supportive atmosphere.</p> <p>Throughout this one-day workshop, you will try your hand at the traditional techniques of Crochet and Macramé, to learn the basics, and construct at least one piece from either discipline. We will be learning, double & treble crochet stitches, and a variety of knotted techniques.</p> <p>What's next? Explore the other Saturday craft workshops on offer with Idea Store Learning.
