Brief Description of Course What will the course cover?	<p>You will learn how to make a stained glass window using traditional leading techniques. The course will cover glass cutting, how to create a cartoon and cut-line, leading, soldering and finishing.</p> <p>You will learn technical terms associated with Stained Glass work and you will have to read instructions and other handouts written in English and discuss them with the tutor and other learners. You will also have to measure quantities of materials and to adjust the quantities accordingly, based on the size of your project. Everyone will be treated equally and every opinion counts. You will be encouraged to discuss materials, techniques and designs from your country or cultural background similar to the ones used in your classes.</p>		
Entry Requirements	None just a willingness to learn.

1	Create a cut-line and cartoon for your design;		
2	Cut and identify glass types;		
3	Lead your simple stained glass project and extend your leading skills to more complex projects;		
4	Learn Soldering skills;		
5	Work confidently and safely with tools and equipment according to your level.

What examination or assessment will there be and what will it involve?

At the beginning of the course an initial assessment takes place to identify your level of experience knowledge or current skills.

The tutor will carry out informal assessments to check your understanding, there is no exam.

You will complete a self-assessment at the beginning, middle and end of the course and you will participate in regular self assessment.

Your tutor will let you know how you are getting on throughout the course, to help you work to your full potential.

At the end of the course you will receive written feedback.

How will I know I am making progress?

You will have an 'Individual Learning Plan' where the course learning outcomes are shown and where you can set individual learning goals and monitor your own progress against these.

You will need to evaluate your own progress and manage your time.

Your tutor will give ongoing feedback and will keep you informed of your progress.

Is there anything else I need to know?

The course does supply all the tools, lead, solder and cement, but students will need to buy the glass for their projects, which is not included in the cost of materials. It is also advisable for you to buy your own glass cutting tool to use in class. This can be discussed with the tutor.

To maximise your chances of benefiting from the course fully we expect you to attend **all** scheduled sessions and that you do so **punctually** and are ready to start learning at the start of the class.
