Roll up, roll up! Next week we are staging a (polite) takeover of historian and broadcaster **Alan Dein**'s monthly 'Reading East London' book club at <u>Brick Lane Bookshop</u> to celebrate the publication of our <u>Cockney Rebels</u> book!

Alan is a longstanding friend of the archives, known by many for his Radio 4 shows 'Lives in a Landscape' and 'Don't Log Off'. An avid collector of Jewish themed jazz records, back in the summer he gave a fantastic talk at the *Cockney Rebels* exhibition launch event which has been included in the book in essay form.

Joining Alan in conversation will be **Robert Jones**, lead curator of *Cockney Rebels* and editor of the book, and **Andrew Lewis**, who wrote the fascinating chapter on the history of Tower Hamlets libraries' music lending service. Both are esteemed members of staff here at Tower Hamlets Local History Library & Archives.

Cockney Rebels explores the story of popular music in the borough beginning with ancient folk ballads like 'The Blind Beggar of Bethnal Green' through to the emergence of the Asian Underground sound and grime. The book collects many previously unseen and remarkable photographs, illustrations and artefacts from the exhibition that beautifully capture the heyday of the Victorian and Edwardian music halls, the dance bands and Jewish jazz in the inter-war years, as well as showcasing so many pioneering artists in genres ranging from pop, rock 'n' roll, R&B and punk.

Secrets from the Cockney Yiddish Music Hall

Thursday 13 February | 6.00-7.30pm | Free, booking required

Songs performed on the London Yiddish stage at the turn of the twentieth century tell of the experiences of immigration from a grassroots perspective. Funny and satirical, edgy, and surprising, the lyrics speak of a community in transition, battling with religious, emotional and ideological hurdles as women and men integrated into British life. **Vivi Lachs** will spill the secrets of the Yiddish halls in an entertaining talk with song. Expect a laugh, a tear, and an all-join-in. No Yiddish knowledge necessary.

Vivi Lachs is a historian of the Jewish East End, a research fellow at Queen Mary, University of London, and Yiddish performer. Her books include *Whitechapel Noise* and *London Yiddishtown*. She founded the Great Yiddish Parade, is the vice chair of the Yiddish Café Trust and leads tours of the Yiddish East End. She sings, records and composes with the bands Klezmer Klub and Katsha'nes.

The Cockney Rebels exhibition continues

From 'The Blind Beggar of Bethnal Green' to 'Bonkers', the people of London's East End have always appreciated a good tune. Our unique history, shaped by its connection to the river as a source of inspiration, work and migration has produced an extraordinary musical legacy, spanning everything from folk songs and sea shanties to music hall, jazz, punk, the Asian underground and grime. Featuring over a hundred rare items selected by staff from the collections of Tower Hamlets Local History Library & Archives, Cockney Rebels: Popular Music in Tower Hamlets, 1624-2003 is a major new exhibition exploring how our borough and its people have inspired and shaped popular music, both locally and globally, over four centuries.

This small exhibition at Tower Hamlets Local History Library & Archives explores the intersection between space, place, fashion, and music in Tower Hamlets' Black music scene. Through youth clubs, bands, blues/shebeens (house parties), festivals, and people, we aim to uncover the diverse ways the community recollect Black music in the borough from 1970-1999.

With contributions and research from local residents **Keira Blasse** and **Nick Friday**, this exhibition narrates an intimate story of memory and joy through Black music culture and heritage in Tower Hamlets.

- What record shops did you go to for the latest tunes?
- Was there a favourite sound clash you remember? Come and share your stories with us.

The exhibition has been curated especially for the first floor landing space at Tower Hamlets History Library & Archives, outside the Reading Room. Free entry.


