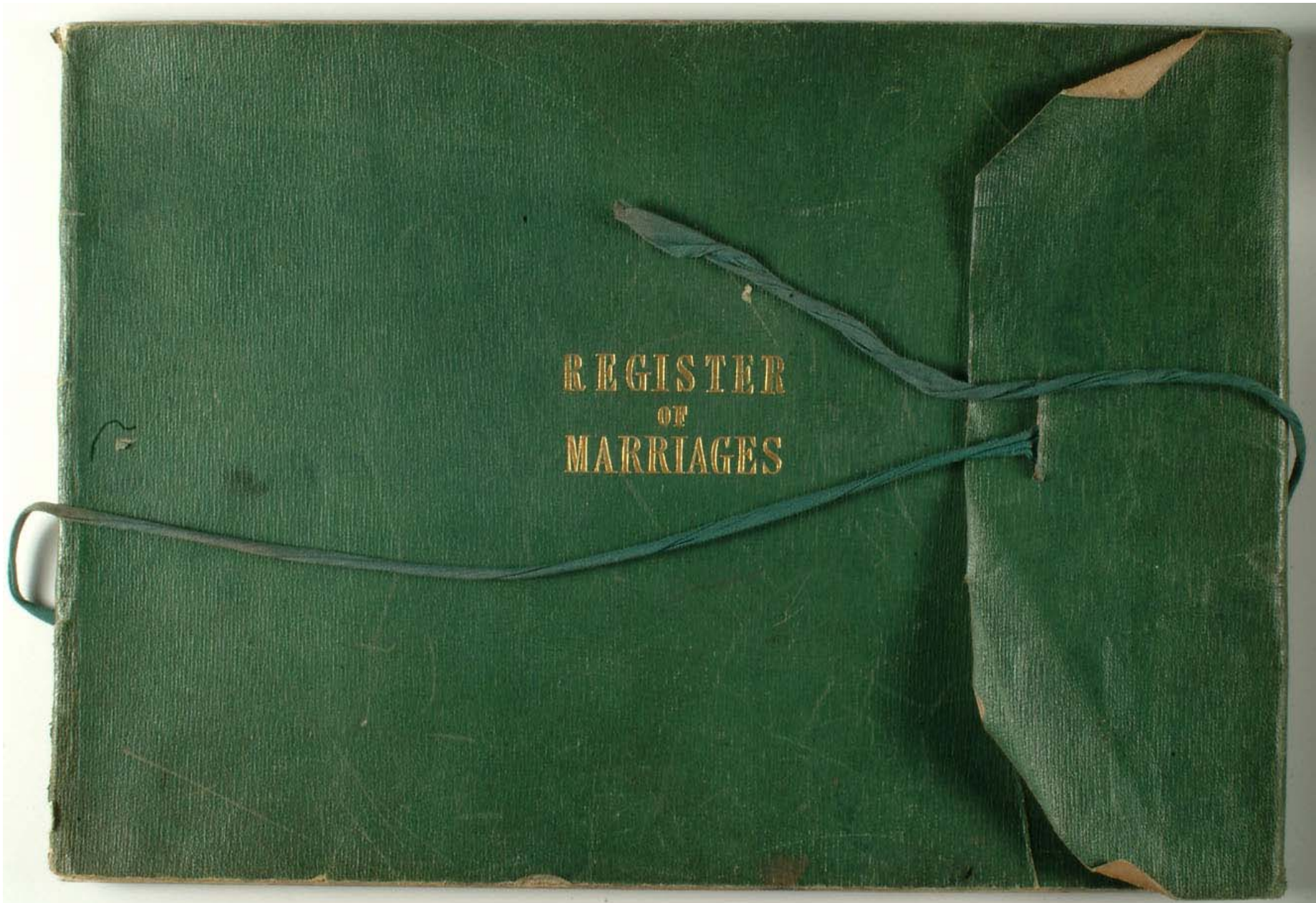

Every Marriage must be registered in duplicate by the registering Officer, "as soon as conveniently may be after the solemnization" (6 and 7 Will. IV., c. 86, s. 31); the Parties, the Registering Officer, and the Witnesses signing in the presence of each other.

Every Marriage must be registered in duplicate by the Secretary of the Synagogue to which the husband shall belong, "immediately after" the ceremony (6 and 7 Will. IV., c. 86, s. 31); the Parties, the Secretary, and the Witnesses signing in the presence of each other.

EXAMPLES showing how ERRORS in Registers of Marriages should be corrected by Registering Officers of the Society of Friends, and by Secretaries of Synagogues.

Errors discovered before an Entry has been completed.

Errors, whether made by the Registering Officer, or by the Secretary of the Synagogue, or by either of the other Parties, should, if discovered *before* the Entry has been completed and signed by the Registering Officer or Secretary of Synagogue, be *forthwith* corrected in the manner shewn in the following Example. An Error in a Signature should be corrected by the party who made it. All other Errors should be corrected by the Registering Officer or Secretary of Synagogue. The Errors should be numbered by the Registering Officer or Secretary of Synagogue in consecutive order, from the first in the Book to the last.

Errors discovered after an Entry has been completed.

Errors discovered *after* the Entry has been completed and signed by the Registering Officer or Secretary of Synagogue, may be corrected under the provisions of the 44th Section of the Registration Act, 6 and 7 Will. IV. cap. 86.—See the following Extract:—

"And be it enacted, that no person charged with the duty of registering any * * * * * Marriage who shall discover any Error to have been committed in the Form or substance of any such Entry, shall be therefore liable to any of the penalties aforesaid if within one calendar month next after the discovery of such Error, in the presence * * * * * of the parties married * * * * *, or, in case of the death or absence of the respective parties aforesaid, then in the presence of the Superintendent Registrar and of two other credible witnesses who shall respectively attest the same, he shall correct the erroneous Entry, according to the truth of the case, by entry in the margin without any alteration of the original Entry, and shall sign the marginal Entry, and add thereto the day of the month and year when such correction shall be made; Provided also that in the case of a Marriage Register he shall make the like marginal Entry, attested in like manner in the Duplicate Marriage Register Book to be made by him as aforesaid, and in every case shall make the like alteration in the Certified Copy of the Register Book to be made by him as aforesaid, or in case such Certified Copy shall have been already made, provided he shall make and deliver in like manner a separate Certified Copy of the original erroneous Entry and of the marginal correction therein made."

As the wording of this Section admits of the correction of "any Error" discovered in a Marriage Register, the Registrar General does not undertake to offer any suggestion tending to limit the discretion of the Registering Officers and Secretaries of Synagogues in the application of this mode of rectifying Errors. It is, however, recommended that they should, in every case, require satisfactory documentary or other proof of an alleged Error, before they commence any alteration under the provisions of this Section.

The following is an Example of the Form of Marginal Note in which such corrections should be made.

An Error in an Entry of Marriage in a Register kept by the Secretary of a Synagogue should be corrected in the same manner as is here set forth as regards Errors in a Register kept by a Registering Officer of the Society of Friends. A Copy of the Entry with the marginal correction, duly certified by the Registering Officer or Secretary of Synagogue, should be forwarded to "The Registrar General, General Register Office, Somerset House, London." If, however, the Return of Certified Copies for the Quarter to which the Entry belongs has not yet been made and delivered, the marginal correction will appear therein, and the transmission of a special Copy of the corrected Entry will be unnecessary.
