

Write Idea, Idea Store's annual FREE festival of reading and books launches TONIGHT at Idea Store Whitechapel with "Voices of the Windrush Generation", a talk by Colin Grant on his new book. [Book your place here!](#) The festival runs over the whole weekend and there is a wide range of fiction, music and young adult as well as the ever popular local history strand.

On Saturday, we at Tower Hamlets Local History Library & Archives will be open as usual for research in our Reading Room over at Bancroft Road 9am to 5pm, but more of us are coming out of the woodwork to host a book stall and information stand. This will be located on the first floor of Idea Store Whitechapel throughout the day and we will be introducing some of the

day's talks on local history themes. Tickets to all events are free and still available - [check out the full Write Idea programme here](#) or check out the local history ones which we have provided direct Eventbrite links for below:

[Punk icon Poly Styrene's little known Somali East End heritage](#) will be discussed in a talk on the new book by her daughter Celeste Bell with co-author Zoe Howe and Kinsi from Numbi Arts. Anne Kershen presents her new book of essays in tribute to [Bill Fishman and his impact on the study of migration to the East End](#). The histories of the ordinary East Enders who make up the bones of [Cockney history will be under discussion by the ever popular Melanie McGrath and Kate Thompson](#), and Janine Booth will present her original research on [Poplar councillor, suffragette and labour activist Minnie Lansbury](#).

We are delighted that historian Hallie Rubenhold will conclude Saturday night with a talk on "The Five", her bestselling book which reclaims the real life stories of the victims of the Whitechapel murders. This is fully booked I'm afraid.

On Sunday we won't be there but there is plenty more local history content at the festival, all FREE, including David Laird on [125 years of Tower Bridge](#), and a screening of the highly recommended new short film by Mile End Community Project on [South Asian restaurants in and around Brick Lane and how they are evolving](#).

Ruth Badley discusses her [personal memoir relating the story of a particular Jewish East End family throughout the twentieth century](#) and the festival will conclude with a performance from Klezmer Klub following Vivi Lachs sharing her recent study of [the abundant sounds and music of Yiddish Whitechapel](#).

There is some service disruption at Whitechapel Station on Saturday 16 and Sunday 17 November and a bus replacement service will run.

However, Shadwell Overground station is roughly a fifteen minute walk to Idea Store Whitechapel.

It is also a 10 minute walk from Bethnal Green tube Station and fifteen from Mile End, which are on the Central line.

Talk: Remembering Blair Peach

Thursday 21 November, 6.00-7.45pm

A teacher at Phoenix School, Bow, Blair Peach died after an anti-racism demonstration in Southall in April 1979. Although his life was cut short, Blair's work activism in Tower Hamlets is remembered and celebrated and this year marks 40 years since his death.

This evening is organised with the National Education Union (Tower Hamlets). The evening will bring together Suresh Grover (The Monitoring Group), Alex Kenny (NEU), Chris Searle (Poet & Activist) and others to remember Blair's work and explore his legacy.

Film Screening: 'Island Race'

Thursday 28 November, 6:00-7:45pm

Island Race (1996) was filmed partly on the Isle of Dogs during an election campaign involving BNP candidate Derek Beackon. The film maker, artist William Raban had been a

resident of the East End for many years at the time of this resurgence of racism as documented in our exhibition. His film records local residents, streets and neighbourhoods on the island at this time. Using just picture and sound, with no voiceover or narrative commentary, the audience is given the space to interpret how racial tensions, class and identity are evoked in this unique record of the mid-1990s East End.

We are delighted to welcome William Raban to introduce the film and host a Q&A afterwards. We are presenting this film screening as part of Explore Your Archive, the national archive awareness campaign, and we will have out on display a selection from our collections relating to the issues addressed in the film and the Isle of Dogs at the time.



Map cataloguing update



Our historic maps are among the most useful and widely consulted resources in our reading room, but until recently only a handful were actually catalogued. Now following a year-long project we're pleased to announce that our **Chronological Map Series** (i.e. the bulk of our non-Ordnance Survey maps) is now fully catalogued and available to browse online. This collection provides a unique insight into how the Borough has changed over time from the Roman era to

the present day, via the railway boom, the Blitz, and more recently the redevelopment of London Docklands.

To browse the entire collection, go to <http://www.thcatalogue.org.uk/>, select 'Map' from the 'Type' field hit Search. You can then re-order the results by date and click on a record to find out more about it. To narrow down your results to maps of a specific place or on a particular theme, you can add a keyword to the 'Any text' field (e.g. "*Bethnal Green*", "*Air raids*"), and to search within a date range (e.g. 1700-1850) just include this to the 'Date' field.

Over the coming months we'll be cataloguing more maps from our **Special Series** and **Building Plans** collections, so keep checking back to see the latest additions.
