Tower Hamlets Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament (S/THC)

We are pleased to report that the Tower Hamlets CND collection has been catalogued and it is now available to view in our reading room. The collection consists of administration records and campaign material such as flyers and posters.

Tower Hamlets Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament (THCND) started off as the 'CND Stepney and Poplar Group' in 1959 originating in the campaign group 'Stepney & Poplar Against The Bomb'. There was a resurgence in its popularity in the 1980s due to the Cruise Missiles. These records predominantly focus on the 1980s and 1990s. They relate to their campaigns, activities and relationships with other organisations such as London Borough of Tower Hamlets Council and Tower Hamlets Youth Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament (THYCND).

The records having been deposited by THCND member Paul Barlow, do reflect his own role within the group but also demonstrate the wide reaching activities and campaigns undertaken by the Campaign.

Lesbian and Gay Campaign Group (S/LGG)

The Tower Hamlets Lesbian and Gay Group collection has also been catalogued and can be accessed in our reading room. The group was born in response to Section 28 (formerly known as Clause 28) of the Local Government Act. The Act stated that a Local Authority "shall not intentionally promote homosexuality or publish material with the intention of promoting homosexuality" or "promote the teaching in any maintained school of the acceptability of homosexuality as a pretended family relationship".

The collection consists largely of press cuttings and promotional material created by the

group, who campaigned against its introduction and lobbied the local council not to enforce it. The press cuttings not only provide a view of the group's actions but also the homophobia that they encountered.

Films about the Somali community in Tower Hamlets (M/SCT)

The latest new accession to be catalogued is a small collection of videos about the Somali community in Tower Hamlets, recently donated by Maggie Hewitt, which we have had digitised. The films date from the 1980s and 1990s, and explore the culture and identity for Somali residents in Britain, with a focus on Tower Hamlets and the Somali community's activities at Oxford House in Bethnal Green. The topics covered in these recordings range from an oral history project conducted by local primary school children to a locally produced public health documentary about the dangers of female circumcision. You can watch these films in our reading room on a laptop and we hope to arrange a public screening event soon.
